# The Pastor's Page

*"For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards." - USCCB, norms*

## *The Precepts of the Church: Observing Days of Fasting and Abstinence*

This is a topic I wrote on recently, both in regard to Friday abstinence (still applicable all days of the year, unless we substitute another penance, and every Friday in Lent) and fasting in general. Still, it's always good to look at these topics again and see if we can glean anything more within the context of the Church's precepts.

First, on abstinence from meat. From the earliest days of the Church, it was common practice to abstain from meat on Fridays. Perhaps you've heard an old cliché rumor that abstinence was instituted as a part of a pact between the fishing industry and the Holy Father way back when. As much as the notion makes me smile, this practice was established long before the Bishop of Rome was in a position to be cutting deals with anyone.

Friday, of course, is the day when Christ went to the Cross, and every Friday has been set aside by Christians as a day of penance. In those days, meat wasn't as common to the diet as it is today, which meant that it was prized and valued a great deal. To abstain from meat on Fridays was to set aside a cherished good. But perhaps it's even more difficult for us, who have meat as a staple in our daily diets: the ancients would marvel at our abundance! Whatever the differences between us, the modern Church stays true to abstinence on Fridays inside and outside of Lent for the same reason, and applies to all Catholic age 14 and above. At least we can be thankful that we are not under the Lenten obligation of Christianity for most of our history: they weren't allowed to eat it at all, until Easter.

And now, on to fasting. Christians fast as another form of penance, a form that is meant to be more intense than merely abstaining from meat. We fast in acknowledgment of our sins, but also to "make room" for God. As I relayed on this subject not too long ago, when we practice fasting, we begin to understand that the body quiets down. It asks for less, and frees us up to focus on God.

In my opinion — big disclaimer here — the modern fasting rules held by the Church won't really get us to this point. Two smaller meals that do not equal one larger meal, all of which we are permitted to consume? I only eat one meal a day to begin with, so by the Church's definition I am in a state of perpetual fast. My waistline disagrees. Still, this is the standard to which we are held, for all between the ages of 18-59. Those above 59 are exempt from fasting, though they are still obligated to abstain from meat. The rules being what they are, I challenge you to think about what fasting might really look like in your own circumstance, just as a friend once challenged me to do the same, such that you too might experience the freedom that comes from this practice.

Above all, what I love about fasting and abstinence is that it urges us *to look beyond ourselves*. Why are we not eating meat today? Why are we limiting our food intake? Because of Christ, in acknowledgment of all he has done, and in acknowledgment of all the times we've looked the other way.

## *Abundance*

I spent this past Thanksgiving at the family home of a very good priest friend. We ate, we drank, and the conversation was good. Every need was met, as is fitting on such a holiday.

Please remember in your prayers those for whom this was not the case. We do our best as a parish to provide for them, but we know there are many in our community we miss. May we not forget them when we bring ourselves before God.

## APPLICATION PROCESS FOR DIACONATE FORMATION PROGRAM

While all the baptized are called to holiness, some men are called by God to holiness through the diaconate. This call must be carefully discerned through a process set forth by the Diocese of Joliet in accordance with the *National Directory for the Formation and Ministry of the Permanent Diaconate in the United States*. Applications are being accepted for the Diaconate (Deacon) Program. Please see below if you meet the Diaconate application requirements:

- A fully initiated Catholic and a practicing member of a parish within the Diocese of Joliet for at least four years,
- At least 31 years of age, but not more than 60,
- A high school diploma or its equivalent and capable of Freshman college level work
- At least three years of significant involvement in some aspect of parish ministry
- If married, be in a valid Catholic marriage and have the consent of his wife,
- If unmarried, be living a celibate lifestyle,
- Demonstrated stability in life situations: marriage, family, employment, residence, physical and emotional health.
- Legal U.S. Residency Status
